

Youth transition center rules

- EMPTY YOUR POCKETS UPON ENTERING THE BUILDING; ALL CONTENTS, INCLUDING CELL PHONES, PAGERS, AND OTHER ELECTRONIC DEVICES WILL BE PLACED IN A LOCKER. YOU AGREE TO BE WANDERED WITH A METAL DETECTOR. ALL CLIENTS ARE REQUIRED TO SIGN IN.
- CONDUCT MUST BE LEFT AT THE DESIGNATED AREA.
- NO PHYSICAL CONTACT OR VERBAL CONFRONTATIONS WILL BE TOLERATED IF YOU HAVE ISSUES WITH ANYONE. PLEASE NOTIFY STAFF.
- YOU ARE EXPECTED TO BEHAVE APPROPRIATELY.
- NO CONTRABAND OF ANY KIND (WEAPONS, DRUGS, ALCOHOL, ETC.) ARE ALLOWED ON PREMISES.
- APPROPRIATE DRESS IS REQUIRED AT ALL TIMES.
- NO GANG COLORS, APPAREL, INSIGNIA, OR REFERENCES. THE YTC IS A NEUTRAL LOCATION. ANY GANG AFFILIATION MUST STAY OUTSIDE.
- NO PROFANITY OR INAPPROPRIATE CONVERSATION.
- NO SMOKING ON THE YTC PREMISES.
- YOU MUST BE PROMPTED AND ACCOMPANIED BY THE BUILDING BY STAFF AT ALL TIMES.
- YOU ARE NOT ALLOWED IN STAFF OFFICES UNLESS INVITED BY STAFF.
- NO GATHERINGS AT THE YTC. PLEASE HAVE SURE BUSES ARE PLANNED AHEAD OF TIME.
- NO TELEPHONE USAGE UNLESS APPROVED AND MONITORED BY YTC STAFF. CALLS WILL BE MADE TO ARRANGE TRANSPORTATION OR IN AN EMERGENCY ONLY.
- PARENTS OR GUARDIANS ARE ALLOWED TO ACCOMPANY YOU INTO THE YTC. SIBLINGS AND FRIENDS ARE NOT ALLOWED WITHOUT PRIOR APPROVAL.
- ALL UNSCHEDULED VISITORS MAY BE DENIED ENTRY IF YTC STAFF OR PROBATION OFFICER IS NOT AVAILABLE. VISITORS ARE ALSO EXPECTED TO FOLLOW THE ABOVE RULES.

What is the YTC?

The YTC is a unique collaboration between a community-based family service agency Tides Family Services and the Dept. of Children, Youth and Families (DCYF). A partner agency supporting this collaborative effort is The Institute for the Study and Practice of Non-Violence.

The Goal of the YTC is to maintain an emphasis on strengthening families within the community by utilizing outreach and tracking, on-site programming, and active participation with juvenile Probation. Stakeholder Partners include, but are not limited to: Caritas, Whitmarsh, AS220, etc. The YTC uses a community-based outreach and tracking model in connection with an Intensive Supervision Program Model with immediate and graduated sanctions.

Youth on Probation or eligible for early release from the Rhode Island Training School who are considered high-risk for:

- Probation violations
- Continued offending or unsafe behaviors
- Sentence or return to the RITS
- From diverse backgrounds
- Males or females aged 13 – 18
- Living in Providence or nearby Cranston

Intensive Supervision Models of Probation and Parole were developed and rescaled by the National Council on Crime and Delinquency (NCCD).
